

ADOPT-A-BENCH



When you participate in the Central Park Conservancy Adopt-A-Bench program, you are helping to maintain Central Park's 10,000 benches.

We will acknowledge a donation of \$10,000 with a personalized plaque on the bench of your choice. Multiple donors may contribute through an honorary or memorial funds. Full payment must be received before you can reserve a bench. Bench adoptions are fully tax deductible, and payment can be made by check, credit card, wire, or stock transfer. Not all benches without plaques are available. Please first consult our map of available bench locations in Central Park. We are happy to provide maps of any of your preferred locations that have benches available.

Some areas of the Park no longer have benches available. These include: the Pond at 60th Street, Conservatory Water (Boat Pond), the *Alice in Wonderland* and *Hans Christian Andersen* statues, Cherry Hill, the East 67th Street entrance, the East 69th Street entrance, the East 72nd Street entrance, the East 76th Street entrance, the East 79th Street entrance, the Great Lawn Oval, the East 90th Street entrance, the Pool at West 102nd Street, Strawberry Fields, the Lake, Engineers' Gate, and the Mall.

You may submit your proposed inscription for the plaque for approval using the form below. Once the fabricator's proof is approved, it takes approximately eight weeks for the plaque to be produced and installed.
